Include their names, descriptions, and use arrows to show family relationships.</p>

Take a tour and write a paragraph or two about what you learn there.</p>	<p> <u>Required:</u> Reading Vocabulary Discussion</p>	<p>Go to "Lessons for Hope" curriculum written by Jane Goodall. Click on the topics and find out what Jane learned about how chimps experience them. Take notes on five important things you learned.</p>
<p>Learn 10 words besides "jambo" in Swahili and make chart to teach the class.</p>	<p>Find out more about one of the scientists Jane admires (mentioned in the first couple of chapters).
